The District World Jamboree 2023 Contingent gave a short presentation concerning their forthcoming adventure in South Korea.

The County Commissioner congratulated this Scout District for all the work and dedication oft the leaders and supporting adults throughout the District

Historically **The Martin Sanders Music Cup** is given to a member of the Scout District for either their musical ability, musical achievements or commitment to the District Band.

This year's recipient joined the band when he was a scout and has been a committed member ever since. During his time with the band he has taken part in the Band's European Tour, National Band Championships; County AGM. One band highlight was when the Band were asked to be part of the New Year's Day London Parade in 1996.

He entered a National competition for Mace bearers and won.

He became Band Master in 1999 when he took over from Andy Spencer

Since that time he has led the band on many



engagements including Bonfire parades in various venues throughout the County; Bognor, Littlehampton, Rustington, East Preston carnivals, Band fund raising activities i.e. Ford Market and Haskins Garden Centre, 'The Great Kick About' at Q.P.R. football stadium a one of the highlights.

His final engagement was in April 2023 when he led the band – carrying the mace at the District's St George's Parade. After 35 years he has decided to change scouting direction and leave the Band.

'Nobby' Knight was awarded the Martin Sanders Music Cup at the District's A.G.M. which was held in the Barons' Hall at Arundel Castle on Thursday 22nd June 2023. He will now keep this Cup. He was also awarded the special gold Mace.
